

GB Folengo *Commentary on the First Epistle of John* (1546)

An extravagant use of superlatives is one of the features of the erotic code which GB Folengo enjoys (one could compare a similarly exaggerated use of superlatives in *Gli Asolani* by Pietro Bembo).

Two lists of the Superlatives found in just the one work, the *Commentary on John*, the second list is almost identical but provides English translations.
